1.     Broadside, 1872  
      "City Election Postponed!"  
      This broadside informs the citizenry of Selma, Dallas Co. that the election for mayor and councilmen has been postponed from 17 December 1872 to May 1873 by order of the General Assembly of Alabama.
  
2.     Broadside, 1874  
      "To the Republicans of Dallas!"  
      This broadside, in the form of a letter signed by "U.S. Grant," discusses the candidates for county office and who among them is a true Republican.
  
3.     Democratic Campaign Book by Campaign Committee of the Democratic Party of Alabama, 1893  
      This campaign booklet lists the Democratic Platform; discusses the background of Reuben F. Kolb, candidate for Alabama Governor, and his stance on the Sayre Law; and the finances of the state of Alabama.
  
4.     Pamphlet, 1868  
      "Roll of the Black Dupes and White Renegades who voted in Mobile City and County for the Menagerie Constitution, for the State of Alabama" published by order of the Constitutional Club of Mobile.  
      This roll lists the voters for the Alabama Constitution by race (white, creole, and black) and location of their vote.
  
5.     Pamphlet, 1877  
      "Law Abiding Democrats to the Front!"  
      This pamphlet is also in the form of a letter by a "Law Abiding Democrat." He exhorts the citizens to not antagonize the negroes by stuffing the ballot boxes, but to recognize elections and remove the Radicals by lawful means.
  
6.     Pamphlet, 1871  
      "Rules and Regulations of the Commissioners of Claims"  
      This lays out the guidelines for Southern loyalists to petition the U.S. government for reimbursement of losses during the Civil War.

7. Broadside, 1878  
"Rooms of the Republican Executive Committee"  
This broadside, from Jere Haralson, Chair of the County Executive Committee, is directed to the Republicans of Dallas Co. He lists the men up for election for U.S. Senators and Representatives, the locations for meetings to discuss the candidates, and the names of those who will address the assemblies.
8. Broadside, 1878  
"To All Honest Republicans of Dallas County"  
This broadside relates the new peace and harmony among the Republican party in Alabama and names the Republicans named to the committee. It notes the role of true Republicanism as sustaining the platform of "Rule or Ruin," and to maintain the dearest rights of freemen.
9. Letter, 1874  
This letter, written by Jasper N. Haney to the Republicans of Selma, Dallas County, discusses the nomination of George H. Craig as Judge in the Criminal Court, who he believes is unworthy of the Republican party.
10. Minutes of the Executive Committee of the Central Council of Democratic and Conservative Party, 1871-1878  
These are the minutes of the Democratic Party in Mobile, Ala. The volume includes minutes of meetings and newspaper clippings concerning their political activities.
